
Holy Angels' Got Talent Fundraiser

The Gaston County Museum (GCM) of Art and History is collaborating with the Gaston County Art Guild (GCAG) and has been working on some exciting endeavors! One endeavor in particular is the "Call for Artists." The GCM is currently show casing the work of our very own Kit Kakassy through 1/4/25. Kakassy has been at the forefront of arts in Gaston County and the region for decades, and for good reason. Her current retrospective exhibit at the museum exemplifies the breadth of her career from intaglio and printmaking to photography, sculpture, and painted works. As an abstract artist, Kakassy's works are bold and energetic, with atmospheric compositions that explode in seemingly three-dimensional forms on canvas.

ANNOUNCING THE JOHN T. BIGGERS COLLECTION

Last year, the GCM received a ground-breaking gift of 250 works by John T. Biggers from the Hazel Biggers Trust. This gift is one of the largest single collections of works on paper from the significant 20th century American artist and Gastonia native. The transformative gift consists of works of art on paper, mural sketches, paintings, and a selection of works from the personal collection of John T. Biggers. The museum hopes to display a portion of the collection in 2025 for the public to view.
